Methodology:

This poll was conducted from May 31 - June 8, 2015, among a statewide sample of 906 registered South Carolina primary voters. The interviews were conducted online and by phone and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of registered South Carolina primary voters based on age, race/ethnicity and gender. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
