Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:
This poll was conducted between April 21-April 25, 2021 among a sample of 1986 Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Registered Voters based on gender, age, educational attainment, race, marital status, home ownership, race, educational attainment, 2016 presidential vote, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
