## Crosstabulation Results

### Methodology:

This poll was conducted from January 29 - February 1, 2016, among a national sample of 1870 registered voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of registered voters based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
