Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted from December 07-10, 2018, among a national sample of 2202 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
