This poll was conducted from January 24-25, 2019, among a national sample of 1168 adults in the U.S. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
