


METHODOLOGY /

This week's report features surveys with registered voters conducted from February 4, 2019 to February 10, 2019. The interviews were weighted to approximate a target sample of registered voters based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region.

Which Candidates Have Momentum in Early Primary States?

We have included an 'Early Primary States' demographic throughout this report to showcase who has momentum going into the primary elections and caucuses. The numbers are aggregated among voters who live in Iowa, New Hampshire, South Carolina, or Nevada.

About Our Democratic Primary Results

Our Democratic Primary results are reported using 11,627 interviews with registered voters who indicate they may vote in the Democratic primary or caucus in their state. For those who say don't know or no opinion, they are asked to pick a candidate they are leaning towards. Results are reported among first choice and those who lean towards a candidate. The margin of error for potential Democratic primary voters is +/- 1%.

About Our Republican Primary Results

Our Republican Primary results are reported using 10,685 interviews with registered voters who indicate they may vote in a Republican primary or caucus in their state. The margin of error for potential Republican primary voters is +/- 1%.



- 1. Joe Biden Leads the Pack Joe Biden receives 29% of the vote, followed by Bernie Sanders who receives 22% and Kamala Harris who comes in third at 13%.
- 2. Biden Leads In Early Primary States Joe Biden receives 33% of the vote among voters living in Iowa, New Hampshire, South Carolina or Nevada.
- **3. Second Choice** Joe Biden and Bernie Sanders are consistently the top second choice for the Democratic nomination.
- **4.** Candidate Coalitions Among the top 5 candidates, Bernie Sanders has the youngest average aged voter (41), while Biden has the oldest (52).
- **5. GOP Primary Challenger** 20% of GOP primary voters support a challenger to Trump.




The analysis below provides a snapshot of the make-up of the top contenders' voter coalitions. For example, 19% of Biden's supporters are under 30 years-old.
