Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted from March 04-05, 2019, among a national sample of 4400 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 1 percentage points.
