This week's report features surveys with registered voters conducted from April 1, 2019 to April 7, 2019. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of registered voters based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region.

Which Candidates Have Momentum in Early Primary States?

We have included an 'Early Primary States' demographic throughout this report to showcase who has momentum going into the primary elections. The numbers reflect voters who live in Iowa, New Hampshire, South Carolina, and Nevada.

About our Democratic Primary Results

Our Democratic Primary results are reported using 13,644 interviews with registered voters who indicate they may vote in the Democratic primary or caucus. For those who say don't know or no opinion, they are asked to pick a candidate they are learning towards, which are factored into the results. The margin of error for potential Democratic primary voters is +/- 1%.

About our Republican Primary Results

Our Republican Primary results are reported using 11,986 interviews with registered voters who indicate they may vote in a Republican primary or caucus. The margin of error for potential Republican primary voters is +/- 1%.






- 1. Joe Biden's first place standing holds amid scrutiny over his conduct with women. His support among all Democratic primary voters dropped by one point, and increased by one point among early primary state voters both negligible shifts within the margin of error.
- 2. However, Biden's favorability has softened in recent weeks the percentage of Democratic primary voters with a very favorable opinion of him has dropped 10 points over the last month.
- **3. Buttigieg's rise continues**: He is up to 5 percent of the vote share among all Democratic primary voters, his third straight week of growth.

WHO'S LEADING THE DEMOCRATIC PRIMARY VOTERS









Over the last month, the share of Democratic primary voters with a very favorable opinion of Biden has dropped by 10 points.



This map displays Trump's net approval (approval minus disapproval) in all 50 states.


He is most popular in:
