Morning Consult is setting a new standard for survey research.



### **KEY TAKEAWAYS /** 06.10.19

- 1. Since announcement peak, Biden has seen a slight drop in support: Over the last month, Biden has dropped from 40% to 37% of the vote share.
  - 1. Over that same period, Warren has gained three points and now has 11 percent of the vote share.
- 2. Warren and Harris supporters are most likely to support one another. A plurality of Warren supporters choose Harris as their second choice. Her supporters are the only group who don't predominantly move to Biden or Sanders.
  - Harris stands to gain a great deal of support as the field begins to narrow. She is a top three second choice for all the other candidates.







This week's report features surveys with registered voters conducted from June 3, 2019 to June 9, 2019. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of registered voters based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region.

Our Democratic Primary results are reported using 17,012 interviews with registered voters who indicate they may vote in the Democratic primary or caucus. For those who say don't know or no opinion, they are asked to pick a candidate they are learning towards, which are factored into the results. The margin of error for potential Democratic primary voters is +/- 1%.

Which Candidates Have Momentum in Early Primary States?

We have included an 'Early Primary States' demographic throughout this report to showcase who has momentum going into the primary elections. The numbers reflect voters who live in Iowa, New Hampshire, South Carolina, and Nevada.
