Morning Consult is setting a new standard for survey research.





## WHO'S LEADING THE DEMOCRATIC PRIMARY | EARLY PRIMARY STATES






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
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## BIDEN'S FAVORABILITY HAS HELD STEADY SINCE THE FIRST DEBATES

Showing favorability among self-reported likely Democratic voters





This week's report features surveys with registered voters conducted from September 23, 2019 to September 29, 2019. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of registered voters based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region.

Our Democratic Primary results are reported using 16,274 interviews with registered voters who indicate they may vote in the Democratic primary or caucus. For those who say don't know or no opinion, they are asked to pick a candidate they are learning towards, which are factored into the results. The margin of error for potential Democratic primary voters is +/- 1%.

Which Candidates Have Momentum in Early Primary States?

We have included an 'Early Primary States' demographic throughout this report to showcase who has momentum going into the primary elections. The numbers reflect voters who live in Iowa, New Hampshire, South Carolina, and Nevada.



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
